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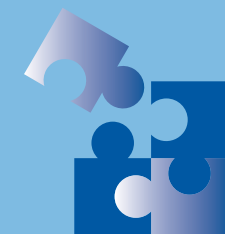

SENIORS IN THE KNOWLEDGE SOCIETY

The project aims at the e-inclusion of seniors in the European environment. Institutions taking part in this Learning Partnership are associated with education for the elderly and ICT (universities of the third age, centres of adult education, national seniors networks). All these institutions are engaged in courses and other activities that promote the e-inclusion of older people in the knowledge society. The main objective of this project is to exchange best practices and experience and to achieve an effective e-inclusion in the EU region, based on high standards. Senior learners play an important role in this project not only because they are the target group of the courses and project activities, but also because their participation can build a more inclusive and intergenerational society.



PROJECT APPROACH

- creating a network of staff, researchers, tutors, teachers and learners
- enabling the information flow by sharing common activities and participating in transnational mobility
- transferring information on courses, activities or processes at partner institutions. Improving or designing new activities (that will be planned, monitored and analyzed cooperatively among all the members) in order to enable the transfer of practices and processes
- publishing and disseminating the results of this project to the local, national, international communities, magazines, newspapers and websites
